

David A. Warrell

Professor Sir David Warrell KCMG DM DSc FRCP FMedSci is Emeritus Professor of Tropical Medicine, and Honorary Fellow of St Cross College, University of Oxford, UK. He trained in medicine and respiratory physiology in Oxford, London, and the University of California, San Diego, and was introduced to tropical medicine research in Ethiopia in 1968. During his residence in Northern Nigeria (1970-7), he developed an interest in snakebite. After returning to Oxford in 1975, he founded Oxford's Tropical Medicine Research Network by establishing the Wellcome-Mahidol University, Oxford Tropical Medicine Research Programme in Bangkok, Thailand, where he lived from 1979 - 1986. He was medical advisor to the Royal Geographical Society, chairman of their Medical Cell (1993-2009), and Council member. His career has been as physician, zoologist, teacher, researcher, resident, traveller, and perpetual student in Africa, Asia, Latin America, and Papua New Guinea. Research interests included malaria, relapsing fever, rabies, other tropical infections, clinical toxinology, especially snakebite, and expedition medicine.
